# MAKE YOUR OWN WREATH



## You'll Need:

- ✿ Fresh greenery (pine, cedar, fir, or a mix)
- ✿ Floral wire, or string
- ✿ Flexible twig or grapevine
- ✿ Scissors
- ✿ Ribbon (optional)



## How to Make It:

Gather small bundles of greenery and shape your twig or grapevine into a circle.

Secure with wire or string.

Lay your first bundle down on your twig or grapevine circle.

Overlap the next bundle on part of the first and secure them to the circle.


Continue layering bundles and shape in a round shape, securing along your twig or grapevine circle.

Fluff, trim any long pieces, and add a bow if you want! A small red ribbon bow graphic.

# SNACK TIME!




## Ingredients

# Funny Pine Cone Facts!!



They open and close like tiny umbrellas depending on the weather.

Squirrels treat pine cones like pizza slices – they sit and spin them while snacking.

Pine cones are so smart they can tell the weather. If it's closed: "Rain coming!" If it's open: "Dry and Clear!"

Some pine cones only open during FIRE. They're like: "Ah yes, warmth! Time to shine!"

A closed pine cone in your pocket is basically a mood ring for nature – it'll open when it feels dry and comfy.



# Pine Cone Nature Creatures



## Materials Needed

- Pine cones (various sizes)
- Scrap paper or cardboard pieces
- Bottle caps or buttons (for eyes)
- Twigs, leaves, acorns, or other nature finds
- Non-toxic glue
- Markers or paint (optional)
- Recycled fabric scraps or yarn (optional)

## Why It's Great

- Uses recycled and natural materials
- Encourages imagination and creativity
- Perfect for fall and winter craft days
- Minimal cost
- Works for ages 4–12 with small adjustments

## Directions

1. Gather items on a nature walk.
2. Choose an animal or creature like a hedgehog, owl, turkey, porcupine, dragon, or an imaginary creature.
3. Build the face.
  - Glue bottle caps or buttons to pine cone for eyes.
  - Use small twigs or rolled paper for nose or beak.
  - Add a scrap-paper mouth.
4. Add details.
  - Leaves or paper for wings or ears.
  - Stick small twigs in the cone spaces for extra texture (porcupine quills)
5. Let it dry.  
Display them on a nature table or turn them into ornaments!







# Winter Window Scavenger Hunt




2-Toilet Paper Rolls

Color and decorate your toilet paper rolls to your liking.


Then, put them side to side and tape them together. Next, take your string or ribbon and pull through each toilet paper roll. Tie the ends together.

### Peanut Butter/Banana Rollups




Tortilla Shell

### Assembly:








- Spread peanut butter out evenly over tortilla shell.
